Dear Friends.

Have you ever heard one of these statements? "The Lord is Risen, now get to work!" "Look at what He did for you, what are you going to do for Him!?"

These statements are commonly called commandments or Law, and they are not the Gospel. The Law was designed to corral the Adam in all of us and its power still shows us our sins, but it no longer defines us. Jesus, after all, died so that we didn't have to work, didn't have to prove anything any longer. The commandments were buried in His death, and we are now free to live in His Resurrection.

Therefore, a new life does not mean recreating the Old Adam in each of us. The Old Adam failed miserably, but still craves law or a scorecard. No, the Resurrection begs us to hear the Good News of the Gospel–

For if through the offence of one (Old Adam) many be dead, much more the grace of God, and the gift by grace, which is by one man (New Adam), Jesus Christ, hath abounded unto many. (Romans 5:15)

The Gospel tells us that we have been given grace upon grace and that we are free. Free to live and love. A new creation has occurred, and we get to experience the first fruits! Praise the Lord! A new life that is free of burdens and to do lists, and open to love and real human interaction.

Real human interaction means being present in the joys and sorrows, being real with one another. We have so many opportunities for fellowship and ministry in May – celebrations of Youth and a baptism – so as the Calendar expands, let us pray for God's grace and love to infuse our work and activities, to be present with us at all times so that we might be present with one another.

Living in Jesus' resurrection means that we are free to be ourselves – no demands – only responses, responses to each other, and to Our Lord, who gave it all up, so that we might have Life, and have it abundantly.

- Q. What are the sacraments?
- A. The sacraments are outward and visible signs of inward and spiritual grace, given by Christ as sure and certain means by which we receive that grace.
- Q. What is grace?
- A. Grace is God's favor toward us, unearned and undeserved; by grace God forgives our sins, enlightens our minds, stirs our hearts, and strengthens our wills.
- Q. What are the two great sacraments of the Gospel? A. The two great sacraments given by Christ to his Church are Holy Baptism and the Holy Eucharist (Communion).

Vestry Musings By Mike Parish

As I write this I am on my back porch, looking across my neighbor's pastures toward Purgatory Mountain. It's a splendid spring evening with blue skies and few clouds, temperatures in the 70's, and light breezes. What a blessing to live in such a wonderful place. That blessing has prompted me to think of other blessings: Reasonably good health, a comfortable home, sufficient food (or more than enough as evidenced by the waistline!), a wonderful family, and a really great church family.

Also I must reflect on transient blessings that cross my path. The person that says, "Good morning," with a smile on his face. The person that pauses in her comings and goings to hold the door for me as I enter a building. The person who signals intent to merge in front of me.

But as they say, life is not entirely a bed of roses. We also encounter those of a far less desirable disposition. We meet people who seem to go through life with a perpetual grudge. Drivers cut us off in traffic. We encounter people who complain vehemently at the slightest issues. And while it can be tempting to respond in a way that we think they "deserve," we need to remember that we as Christians are called to live as Christ would want us to live.

When we encounter those with a less than desirable disposition, we need to pause and to consider how their circumstances might have affected their action. Perhaps that person is in severe pain due to illness, or is worried about when the next meal will come or if their house will be foreclosed. There are many who don't have all the blessings that some of us do.

And so let us practice Christian charity, mercy, and forbearance when we encounter those of an ill nature. Show kindness and pleasantness, even as hard as that might be. And even if it doesn't change that person, our example might inspire others to become better. And in so doing, it makes us better Christians.


There will be a light refreshment reception afterwards in the church Parish Hall.
