Opening Sentences

Confession of Sin

Officiant: Dear friends in Christ, here in the presence of Almighty God, let us kneel in silence, and with penitent and obedient hearts confess our sins, so that we may obtain forgiveness by his infinite goodness and mercy.

[Officiant leads and people join in]

Most merciful God, we confess that we have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done, and by what we have left undone. We have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We are truly sorry and we humbly repent. For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, have mercy on us and forgive us; that we may delight in your will, and walk in your ways, to the glory of your Name. Amen.

Officiant: Almighty God have mercy on you [us], forgive you [us] all your [our] sins through our Lord Jesus Christ, strengthen you in all goodness, and by the power of the Holy Spirit keep you [us] in eternal life. Amen.

[A deacon or lay person using the preceding form remains kneeling, and substitutes "us" for "you" and "our" for "your."]

The Invitatory and Psalter

1 Sing with joy to God our strength *
and raise a loud shout to the God of Jacob.

**2 Raise a song and sound the timbrel, *

3 Blow the ram's-horn at the new moon, *
and at the full moon, the day of our feast.

**4 For this is a statute for Israel, *
a law of the God of Jacob.**

5 He laid it as a solemn charge upon Joseph, *
when he came out of the land of Egypt.

**6 I heard an unfamiliar voice saying, *
"I eased his shoulder from the burden;
his hands were set free from bearing the load."**

7 You called on me in trouble, and I saved you; *

O Israel, if you would but listen to me!**

9 There shall be no strange god among you; *
you shall not worship a foreign god.

**10 I am the Lord your God,
who brought you out of the land of Egypt and said, *
"Open your mouth wide, and I will fill it."**

11 And yet my people did not hear my voice, *
and Israel would not obey me.

**12 So I gave them over to the stubbornness of their hearts, *
to follow their own devices.**

13 Oh, that my people would listen to me! *
that Israel would walk in my ways!

**14 I should soon subdue their enemies *
and turn my hand against their foes.**

15 Those who hate the Lord would cringe before him, *
and their punishment would last for ever.

**16 But Israel would I feed with the finest wheat *
and satisfy him with honey from the rock.**

**2 "How long will you judge unjustly, *
and show favor to the wicked?"**

3 Save the weak and the orphan; *
defend the humble and needy;

The First Lesson.Acts 3:12-26

¹²When Peter saw it, he addressed the people, 'You Israelites,* why do you wonder at this, or why do you stare at us, as though by our own power or piety we had made him walk? ¹³The God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob, the God of our ancestors has glorified his servant* Jesus, whom you handed over and rejected in the presence of Pilate, though he had decided to release him. ¹⁴But you rejected the Holy and Righteous One and asked to have a murderer given to you, ¹⁵and you killed the Author of life, whom God raised from the dead. To this we are witnesses. ¹⁶And by faith in his name, his name itself has made this man strong, whom you see and know; and the faith that is through Jesus* has given him this perfect health in the presence of all of you.

17 'And now, friends,* I know that you acted in ignorance, as did also your rulers. ¹⁸In this way God fulfilled what he had foretold through all the prophets, that his Messiah* would suffer. ¹⁹Repent therefore, and turn to God so that your sins may be wiped out, ²⁰so that times of refreshing may come from the presence of the Lord, and that he may send the

Messiah* appointed for you, that is, Jesus, ²¹who must remain in heaven until the time of universal restoration that God announced long ago through his holy prophets. ²²Moses said, “The Lord your God will raise up for you from your own people* a prophet like me. You must listen to whatever he tells you. ²³And it will be that everyone who does not listen to that prophet will be utterly rooted out from the people.” ²⁴And all the prophets, as many as have spoken, from Samuel and those after him, also predicted these days. ²⁵You are the descendants of the prophets and of the covenant that God gave to your ancestors, saying to Abraham, “And in your descendants all the families of the earth shall be blessed.” ²⁶When God raised up his servant,* he sent him first to you, to bless you by turning each of you from your wicked ways.’
